professional soccer stadium project to Homestead, working through complex negotiations and stakeholder coordination to support the city's long-term economic development vision. His work on public-private development initiatives has also included negotiating a \$60 million public-private partnership to develop an entertainment complex and transit hub featuring a movie theater, bowling alley, arcade, 1,000-space municipal parking garage, and 30,000 square feet of retail liner space.

Prior to joining the firm, Matthew worked with a prominent South Florida real estate developer overseeing the development, redevelopment and acquisition of residential projects with a focus on work force and low-income housing by leveraging government funding sources, including Community Development Block Grant funds and Low Income Housing Tax Credits to leverage private investment in the completion of the projects.
