



**CITY OF DORAL EMERGENCY ORDER No. 2020-47**  
**Extension of Local State of Emergency Orders 2020-36, 2020-37 & 2020-44**

**WHEREAS**, on May 14, 2020 Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-122. initiating Phase 1 of the Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery to Miami Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020 the City of Doral declared a local State of Emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Miami Dade County issued Amendment No. 2 to Miami Dade County Emergency order No 26-20; and

**WHEREAS**, The County's New Order closes restaurants except for outdoor dining, takeout and delivery; and

**WHEREAS**, the City recognizes the impact of economic hardship, but the risk of COVID-19 infection is still real for all Floridians. Therefore, each business should review the guidance that is relevant to their workplace, prepare a plan based on the guidance for their industry, and put it into action; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Charter grants to the Mayor in a State of Emergency the authority to take actions as may be necessary to protect the lives and health of the citizens of Doral.



**THEREFORE**, under the of Section 1.04 of the City Charter, and the home rule powers permitted under the Constitution and laws of the State, the City of Doral will open and implement the County's reopening plan.

**Section 1. Executive Order Extending the Declaration of Local State of Emergency.** The Declaration of the State of local Emergency is extended for seven (7) days if not cancelled before that period of time. Concurrent with this Declaration is the authority to take the actions set forth in those Emergency Orders, for the duration of this Declaration.

**Section 2. Extension of City of Doral Parks.** City of Doral Parks are open as per City of Doral Emergency Order 2020-27. The recreation centers will remain closed until further notice.

**Section 3. Summer Camps and Youth Sports.** Summer camps and Youth sports will be allowed if conducted in conformance with Miami Dade County's Emergency Order 23-20, as amended, and the Moving to A New Normal Handbook incorporated into that order and adopted by the City.

**Section 4. Re-Opening.** The City has adopted and will continue to follow the guidance contained in the New Normal Guide for reopening businesses in Doral.

**Section 5. Failure to comply.** Failure to comply with this Order shall constitute a misdemeanor subject to fines and imprisonment punishable as provided in F.S. §§ 775.082 and 775.083.



The Emergency measures that have been ordered and promulgated above effective are extended through September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020.
