

LOCAL EMERGENCIES MEASURES IMPLEMENTED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH GARDENS, FLORIDA

EMERGENCY ORDER No. 20-05

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2020, the City of Hialeah Gardens, Florida issued Emergency Order No. 20-03 in order to protect the health and welfare of the residents of the City from COVID-19/ novel coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 continues to threaten the health and welfare of the residents of Hialeah Gardens, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor finds that more restrictive measures will further protect the residents of the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor finds it in the best interest of the residents to amend Emergency Order 20-03 and expand the restrictions for the City and its residents.

Therefore, I, Yioset De La Cruz, Mayor of the City of Hialeah Gardens, Florida, hereby order that Emergency Order 20-03 be amended as follows:

- All patrons entering businesses that remain open during the stay at home order shall be required to a form of covering over their nose and mouth at all times while inside the business facility.
- 2. All individuals providing delivery services shall wear a form of covering over their nose and mouth while making deliveries.
 - a. A covering over the nose and mouth may include a face mask, homemade mask, or other cloth covering, such as a scarf, bandana, handkerchief or other similar cloth covering.
- 3. All essential retail and commercial establishment employees shall wear personal protective equipment, such as facial covering described in 2(a) of this order as well as gloves, subject to the availability of such items.
- 4. All delivery personnel shall wear personal protective equipment when delivery items to both residential as well as commercial locations.

- 5. Nothing herein shall operate to restrict any employee or customer from accessing any essential retail or commercial establishment to address any emergency or other exigent circumstance, even if a covering over the nose and mouth is not readily accessible at the time of such emergency or other exigent circumstance.
- 6. Medical and surgical face masks, such as "N95" masks or other similar medical or surgical masks, are in short supply and should be reserved for health care personnel and other first responders with the greatest need for such personal protective equipment. Persons are encouraged to review and comply with the CDC and Florida Department of Health guidelines on personal protective equipment, including with respect to the use of a medical or surgical face mask, such as an "N95" mask or other similar medical or surgical mask.
