

LOCAL EMERGENCIES MEASURES IMPLEMENTED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF HIALEAH GARDENS, FLORIDA

EMERGENCY ORDER No. 20-06

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2020, the City of Hialeah Gardens, Florida issued Emergency Order No. 20-03 in order to protect the health and welfare of the residents of the City from COVID-19/ novel coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 continues to threaten the health and welfare of the residents of Hialeah Gardens, Florida; and

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2020, the City issued Emergency Order No. 20-05 expanding the restrictive measures ordering the use of masks when entering businesses located in the City of Hialeah Gardens; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor finds that more restrictive measures will further protect the residents of the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor finds it in the best interest of the residents to amend Emergency Order 20-05 and expand the restrictions for the City and its residents.

Therefore, I, Yioset De La Cruz, Mayor of the City of Hialeah Gardens, Florida, hereby order that Emergency Order 20-05 be amended as follows:

- 1. All previous restrictions included in Emergency Order 20-05 are ordered continue.
- 2. All individuals in the City of Hialeah Gardens are required to wear a form of covering over their noses and mouths at all times except:
 - a. When riding in a personal vehicle;
 - b. When alone in a separate single space;

- c. When no one but their shelter group (household members) is present;
- d. When necessary for consumption purposes;
- e. When necessary for purposes of a health emergency;
- f. When necessary for any other health and safety reason, the validity and reasonableness of which shall be solely determined by the City of Hialeah Gardens.
- A covering over the nose and mouth may include a face mask, homemade mask, or other cloth covering, such as a scarf, bandana, handkerchief or other similar cloth covering.
- 4. Cloth face coverings should not be placed on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.
- All essential retail and commercial establishments are ordered to implement policies for employees to use other personal protective equipment, such as gloves, subject to the availability of such items
- Medical and surgical face masks, such as "N95" masks or other similar medical or surgical masks, are in short supply and should be reserved for health care personnel and other first responders with the greatest need for such personal protective equipment.
- 7. Persons are encouraged to review and comply with the CDC and Florida Department of Health guidelines on personal protective equipment, including with respect to the use of a medical or surgical face mask, such as an "N95" mask or other similar medical or surgical mask.
- 8. All essential businesses are encouraged, subject to availability of necessary sanitizing products to:
 - a) Provide alcohol-based hand sanitizers for use by customers and employees; and
 - b) Provide disinfecting wipes at points of entrance, cash registers, and/or other appropriate locations, for customers to disinfect carts, shopping baskets, or point of sale terminals, or, alternatively designate staff responsible for disinfecting carts, shopping baskets, point of sale terminals, and other areas as frequently as possible; and
 - c) Implement procedures for custodial or janitorial staff to sanitize frequent touch points throughout the day, including point of sale terminals at registers, conveyor belts, door handles, door plates, shelves, and other appropriate locations.

- 9. All requirements of Emergency Orders from the City of Hialeah Gardens, Miami-Dade County and State of Florida shall be strictly adhered to at all times.
- 10. The provisions of this Emergency Order may be enforced within the boundaries of the City of Hialeah Gardens by the City's law enforcement agency, as well as the City's Code Enforcement Officers.
- 11. This Order is effective on April 11, 2020 at 12:01 am and shall remain in full force and effect until terminated.
- 12. The Order will extend for the same period of time as the City of Hialeah Gardens Declaration of Local Emergency executed on March 13. 2020, including any extensions of same.
