



ORDER NO 2020-04

EMERGENCY ORDER 2020-04 IMPLEMENTED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF MIAMI GARDENS, FLORIDA

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis promulgated Executive Order 20-52 and declared a State of Emergency in Florida in response to COVID-19, and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 20-52, Section (4)(D)(1) provides that each municipality in the State of Florida is authorized to waive the procedures and formalities otherwise required of the political subdivision by law pertaining to the taking of whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the public's health, safety, and welfare, and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 20-52 was extended by Executive Order 20-114 for a period of sixty (60) days from May 8, 2020, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of law and Sections 252.31-252.60, Florida Statutes, the City of Miami Gardens City Council ratified the Declaration of a Local Emergency imposed by Mayor Oliver G. Gilbert, III, on March 11, 2020, and authorized the City Manager, in consultation with the Mayor to take all necessary actions consistent with the Declaration of a Local State of Emergency, and

WHEREAS, On April 1, 2020, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis Florida issued Executive Order 20-91 and On March 19, 2020, Miami Dade County Mayor issued Emergency Order 07-20 including amendments, has defined all essential retail and commercial establishments, and

WHEREAS, the Miami Dade County Mayor Emergency Order 07-20 as amended, has established municipalities may impose more stringent standards within their jurisdictions, and

WHEREAS On April 22, 2020 the Council City adopted Resolution 2020-053-3451 authorizing the Mayor to issue Emergency Orders that may be more restrictive than those Orders issued by the Governor and County Mayor, when permitted by law and to ratify any orders previously issued by Mayor Gilbert, in an effort to protect the health, safety and welfare of the Residents of the City of Miami Gardens, and

WHEREAS, the effects of Covid-19 continue to require extraordinary and immediate actions by the City of Miami Gardens in order to protect the public's health, safety and welfare, and

WHEREAS, according to the Centers of Disease Control ("CDC"), it is critical to maintain 6-feet social distancing to slow the spread of the virus and persons should use masks when possible, to slow the spread of the virus and help people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others, and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a natural emergency whose increasing effects are being felt within the City of Miami Gardens and that on account thereof, there is reason to believe that it is necessary to take whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Miami Gardens,

NOW THEREFORE, I Oliver G. Gilbert, III, Mayor of the City of Miami Gardens, acting under the authority granted to municipalities by Florida Statutes Section 252.38, and Executive Order Numer 20-52 promulgated by Governor Ron DeSantis on March 9, 2020, the authority granted to me by the Miami Gardens Charter Section 2.1 (A)(4) and 2.1(A)(5) and Resolution No. 2020-042-3440 adopted by the City Council of the City of Miami Gardens, hereby Order and promulgates the following local Emergency Mearsures for the City of Miami Gardens effective May 27, 2020 at 12:00 a.m.

Barber Shops, Beauty Salons and Nail Shops will be allowed to re-open with the following operational conditions.

Employee and Customer Protective Measures:

- Use ALL disposable materials & supplies.
- Employees must not share tools.
- Services will be provided by appointment only.
- No walk-in customers.
- Provide hand sanitizer/sanitization wipes to customers upon arrival.
- Post a sign outside the front door/window stating that any customer who has a fever or any COVID-19 symptoms must reschedule their appointment.
- Employees should have temperature checks at the beginning of each workday. No employee with a fever or any COVID-19 symptoms will provide services to clients.
- Businesses must limit the number of clients in the store to one (1) customer per service provider.
- Work stations should be separated by at least six (6) feet.


- If stations cannot be separated by six (6) feet, install a plexiglass barrier between salon chairs.
- Shops with limited square footage must stagger the work schedules to adhere to social distancing requirements.
- No persons will be allowed to wait in the store; customers must wait in their cars until the service provider is ready.
- All employees and customers must wear face masks or coverings.
- Customers may remove face masks or coverings for a short time when necessary to perform face-to-face services (i.e., beard/mustache trim, eyelashes, eyebrow arch, or facials).
- The use of face shields is required for face-to-face services.
- Employees must wear protective gloves.
- Employees should wear a single-use lab-coat or protective gown.
- All equipment, chairs, and tables used by an employee must be sanitized between clients.
- All nail station items must either be new or cleaned and disinfected (stored in a closed container until ready to use).
- A notice must be posted encouraging customers to use credit/debit cards or Paypal/Venmo/CashApp for payment of services.

If all businesses follow their common cleaning and sanitization practices the risk of contamination is considerably mitigated. Employees must continue to sanitize their work areas before the start of business, and after the close of business each day.

ALL OTHER BUSINESSES SHALL REMAIN CLOSED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

The Emergency Measures set forth herein shall be in addition to all prior Local Emergency Measures ordered and promulgated by the City of Miami Gardens.

All requirements and directives contained in this Local Emergency Measure, as well as all active Miami-Dade County Emergency Orders and all Executive Orders issued by Florida Governor Ron DeSantis shall be strictly adhered to at all times and enforceable pursuant to the Code of the City of Miami Gardens and Chapter 252, Florida Statutes.
