DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY

---

Pursuant to City Code Section 22-86(6) of the Miramar City Code, a State of Emergency is hereby declared within the jurisdiction of the City of Miramar, Florida, as a result of the public health threat posed by COVID-19 (Coronavirus).

- I. Nature of emergency: The State of Florida Department of Health has declared a state of emergency due to the global threat of the coronavirus. The virus is considered a pandemic as it has affected countries worldwide. In addition, Broward County has declared a state of emergency and is following recommendations from the State to cancel or postpone major events.
- II. Designation of appropriate boundaries: City limits of the City of Miramar, Florida.
- III. Conditions which have brought the emergency about: The virus continues to threaten the health and safety of the public, with numerous cases reported in Broward county.
- IV. In accordance with Section 22-86(6) of the City Code, subsequent orders may be issued if conditions persist.
- V. The state of emergency shall be initiated by this declaration, and shall continue until the Mayor and the City Manager find that the threat or danger no longer exists and/or until an emergency meeting of a quorum of the City Commission or a regular meeting can take place and terminate the state of emergency by resolution. This declaration of emergency is limited to seven days in duration and may be extended, as necessary, in seven day increments.
- VI. Executive Orders issued by State of Florida and Broward County emergency management agencies pertaining to the above described event shall be followed and implemented within the City, as applicable.
