

EMERGENCY ORDER

On March 28, 2020, a State of Emergency pursuant to §92.14(B) of the City Code of Ordinances and Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, was declared in the City of Pembroke Pines by Mayor Frank C. Ortis relating to the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (“COVID-19”).

On April 29, 2020, the Broward County Administrator executed Emergency Order 20-08 (the “Order”) providing for the limited re-opening of certain facilities, including parks, marinas and golf courses. A copy of the Order, Exhibit A, is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

On April 29, 2020, the Mayor of the City of Pembroke Pines executed an emergency order embracing the limited re-opening set forth in the Order, in part, and providing for the closure of all active and passive parks in the City.

Consistent with the County’s Order, the City intends to re-open certain parks in the City, subject to restrictions, limitations and social distancing guidelines.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Mayor of the City of Pembroke Pines, pursuant to the authority set forth in Ch. 252, F.S., and Section 92.14(B) of the City’s Code of Ordinances, and all other applicable laws, promulgates the following Emergency Order:

Section 1. Certain City-owned parks, as identified on Exhibit B, shall be opened to the public, subject to all restrictions, limitations and social distancing guidelines set forth in Broward County Emergency Order 20-08, as may be amended. In addition to the restrictions, limitations and guidelines set forth in the Order, the following conditions shall apply at all open City parks:


- a. Use of tennis courts shall only be permitted at the Pembroke Lakes Tennis Center located at 10500 Taft Street, Pembroke Pines, FL 33062. Availability of courts at this location shall be on a first come, first served basis. Fees for this facility will be waived until further notice. All other tennis courts at City-owned parks shall remain closed.
- b. Racquetball courts and basketball courts at all City parks shall remain closed.
- c. Restrooms at all City parks shall remain closed.

Section 2. In the event of any conflicts between this order and Broward County Order 20-08, this order shall govern and prevail.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Emergency Order is effective as of 12:01 a.m. on May 11, 2020 and shall remain in full force and effect until terminated.
